This is the 2013 Annual Report for PW in Redstone Presbytery that I prepared to be presented at the Presbytery Meeting on March 18, 2014 at the First Presbyterian Church of Belle Vernon.

## February 2013

The members of the PW Coordinating Team gathered to assemble and mail the February newsletter for distribution to PW groups in Redstone Presbytery.

## April 2013

The members of the PW Coordinating Team gathered to assemble the April newsletter, Mission Packet, and the Redstone PW Directory for distribution at the Spring Gathering on April 13.

The Spring Gathering was held April 13 at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Greensburg. Rev. Helen Kester, pastor of the Derry Presbyterian Church and Spring Gathering Coordinator, led the gathering in worship with the title "Love is a Verb"; Jack Metcalfe spoke about his congregation's continuing ministry in Haiti; Rev. Michael Shepard talked about the Youth Triennium and the spiritual impact that it has on the teens who attend; and Judy Koontz spoke about current mission projects. There was opportunity for women to share the mission projects that their various PW groups and churches are engaged in. Pasta, oatmeal and raisins were brought to the gathering to be given to Pine Springs Camp. The women of Westminster church served a delicious lunch and displayed the dresses that they had sewn to be sent to Africa. Fair Trade items were available for sale from Haiti and from SERRV. The business meeting was held to elect members of the Coordinating team for Redstone PW and for the Synod PW Coordinating Team. The newly elected Coordinating Team members were installed.

The Love Gift of \$1,116 was awarded to Cheryl Croushore to be used toward the cost of transportation for 29 youth to attend the Youth Triennium at Purdue University July 16-20, 2013.

## May 2013

The Birthday Offering was received, totaling \$1909.97. This and the Thank Offering are the church-wide offerings for PW.

The Spring Retreat was held May 28, 2013, at Pine Springs Camp, Jennerstown, PA., with 44 women attending. "Lord, Teach Us to Pray" was the theme of the retreat led by the Rev. Carole Isley Corey. Participants brought 85 boxes of graham crackers, Hershey bars, and marshmallows for the making of S'mores for summer campers. The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was celebrated at the close of the Retreat.

## June 2013

June 7-8, 2013. The Synod of the Trinity PW Southwest Regional Gathering was held at Jumonville Camp and Conference Center in Hopwood, PA. Rev. Sylvia Carlson, Susan Nesti, Linda Blick, Phyllis Frye, Anna Jean Carnahan, Judy Hauser, and Carolee Ackinclose attended. The theme was "Where Angels Tread," a Bible study written by the Rev. Heather Sigler, Carlisle Presbytery, so that attendees would be aware of and have appreciation for, the role of angels in scripture.

The Redstone Coordinating Team met to plan the Fall Gathering and discuss plans for 2014.

#### August 2013

The fall newsletter was assembled and sent out to all churches. Pledge forms and accompanying letters were sent out to PW Moderators, with a request for 2014 pledges to be received by November 1, 2013.

#### September 2013

The Synod PW Coordinating Team met at Antiochian Village for the annual meeting to plan upcoming Synod events and conduct the business at hand. In attendance were: Linda Blick, Synod Search Committee member and Redstone Liaison Coordinator; Sylvia Carlson, Redstone PW Moderator; and Susan Nesti, Redstone Vice Moderator and Synod Hospitality Chair. The Rev. Thomas Tut of the South Sudan Presbyterian Evangelical Church was invited to speak to the assembled women.

September 29 to October 1, 2013, was the fourth annual PW mission trip to New Windsor, MD. 31 persons attended from churches around Redstone Presbytery and worked as volunteers in the SERRV warehouse checking in, pricing and re-packing Fair Trade items as well as in the Church World Service warehouse, assembling and packing health, baby, school, and sewing kits.

#### October 2013

On October 26, 2013, the Fall Gathering was held at the Vandergrift United Presbyterian Church, Vandergrift, PA with 46 women attending. Sue Blank, PW Treasurer, led us in worship; Cheryl Croushore, Associate for Christian Formation, Redstone Presbytery, spoke about the resources available at the Presbytery Resource Center; PW Mission Coordinator Judy Koontz brought us up to date on 2013 and 2014 Global & Local Missions; Phyllis Frye led the Horizons Players in a skit; Carolee Ackinclose spoke about ways to celebrate the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of PW; Captain Pamela Rhodes from the Salvation Army gave a presentation on Human Trafficking; and Rev. Donna Havrisko, Pastor, Westminster Presbyterian Church, Greensburg, led an introduction to the 2013-2014 Horizons Bible Study, "An Abiding Hope: The Presence of God in Exodus and Deuteronomy" by Janice Catron. The women of the church provided a delicious lunch. Donations were made to the Kiski Area Loving Ministry which provides a Food Bank for the local community. SERRV items were available for purchase.

#### November 2013

Pledges were received from 22 PW groups. The pledges totaled \$10,644.50, allocated as follows: Churchwide PW Mission, \$9,595; Synod PW, \$440; and Redstone \$609.50. It is this pledge money that makes it possible to print and mail newsletters to every church in the Presbytery (regardless of whether or not they contribute monetarily to the work of Redstone Presbyterian Women) and print the annual yearbook, as well as sending our representatives to Synod PW Coordinating Team and Churchwide PW Coordinating Team meetings. The Thank Offering for 2013 in the amount of \$8,473.92 was received.

The Redstone PW Coordinating Team met to plan the Spring Gathering, Spring Retreat, and the January 2014 Redstone Link Newsletter.

As my four years as Moderator of Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery of Redstone come to a close, I turn over the gavel of leadership to Susan Nesti. She will be installed at the PW Spring Gathering at the Colver Presbyterian Church on March 29.

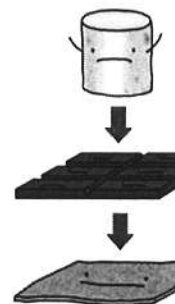

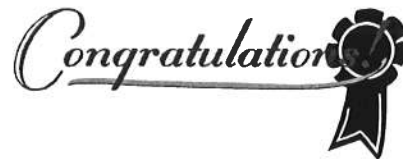

## STOP HUNGER NOW

I wanted to give you an update on the **STOP HUNGER NOW** Project\*\*. Our goal is to raise \$10,000 so Redstone Presbytery can host a meal packaging event of 40,000 meals. In order to reach our goal, several ways are available in which you can help.

- **Collecting new or gently used shoes** which we sell to a recycling company. To date, shoes are being collected in 8 churches and I have 5 more that are seeking permission to collect in their churches, but we need more churches to get involved. Just ask and you will be surprised how many shoes you can get. Put a box in a convenient spot and tell your people how they can help. Shoes can be dropped off at the Presbytery Office or Community UP Church in New Alexandria. I will also pick up shoes. Just call 724-668-2843. All the money raised by recycling shoes will help reach the goal of \$10,000.

**STOP HUNGER NOW's** meal packaging program predominately provides meals to support school feeding programs in schools and orphanages around the world. This is a pivotal step because children in impoverished areas are often sent to school so they will be fed. The education they receive is the turning point at which many negative factors such as infant mortality, disease and gender equality are impacted and communities can begin to heal themselves.
