Pakistan is passing through an era in which people are facing economic depression, frustration of joblessness. The female community is the highly affected group, looking for factors that can provide socio- economic relief. There are young girls who are exposed to specific risks and whose rights are violated every day. Children are victims of man-made catastrophes. Girls from minority groups are victims of racism. Some girls are exposed without protection to psychological and emotional hardships, living under threatening conditions, and victims of violence in the family.

Total population of Pakistan is 160 million. Female population is 47.5%. Literacy rate of females is 18%. 60.8% of females are engaged in agricultural work. Only 4.3% of the females are 65 and above.
