“A Path to Truth”

The conflictive state of affairs in our culture brought to my mind this powerful prayer of Jesus as he faced crucifixion and, thus, as his followers soon faced a world without his physical presence to lean upon:

"Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth by finishing the work

that you gave me to do...I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one...I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth” (John 17:1b-4, 9-11, 15-17).

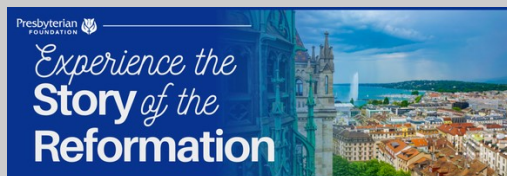
Given the divisions we’re experiencing, it is not surprising that Jesus prayed for unity among the apostles during his own earthly ministry. Division seems to be a human trait. It’s a trait that arises at the most puzzling times. In my nuclear family, my sister and her husband, and my wife and I tended to see life in a similar way. On the other hand, the two other siblings looked at life quite differently (and consistent with our parents). After a few Thanksgivings at our parents’ home in northwestern Ohio, my sister and I clearly learned the state of affairs among us. Thus, a few weeks before our arrival from southwestern Pennsylvania, I’d say to my wife, “Well, it’s time to go to therapy to prepare!” And during their travels from Louisville, my brother-in-law learned to ask my sister, “All right! What topics are we NOT allowed to discuss this year?”

As I consider the fact that all three of my siblings and both of my parents are no longer with us, I also reflect on my regret that we couldn’t learn to do better. I’ve dreamed about what it would have been like if we had learned to have passionate, yet respectful discussions about meaningful, difficult issues so that we experienced that oneness for which Jesus prayed and pushed away that cool silence and open hostility that was accomplished by the evil one.

That’s what the church is to be about. And I believe we are called to be about that NOW. In my years in teaching Ethics, students would occasionally ask to engage in debates. I’d always refuse: students in my classes learned to engage in respectful, informed.
